


Prerequisite Chart for Canadian and World Studies - Geography

This chart maps out all the courses in the discipline and shows the link between courses and the possible prerequisites for them.

It does not attempt to depict all possible movements from course to course.



GEOGRAPHY

Geography of Canada CGC 1D1 (ACADEMIC)

This course explores Canada's distinct and changing character and the geographic systems and relationships that shape it. Students will investigate the interaction of natural and human systems within Canada, as well as Canada's economic, cultural, and environmental connections to other countries. Students will use a variety of geo-technologies and inquiry and communication methods to analyze and evaluate geographic issues and present their findings.

Géographie du Canada CGC 1DF (ACADEMIC – FRENCH IMMERSION)

This course is one of ten compulsory courses for French Immersion students. This course explores Canada's distinct and changing character and the geographic systems and relationships that shape it. Students will investigate the interactions of natural and human systems within Canada, as well as Canada's economic, cultural, and environmental connections to other countries. Students will use a variety of geo-technologies and inquiry and communication methods to analyze and evaluate geographic issues and present their findings. (Offered in 2020-21)

Geography of Canada CGC 1P1 (APPLIED)

This course focuses on geographic issues that affect Canadians today. Students will draw on personal and everyday experiences to learn about Canada's distinct and changing character and the natural and human systems and global influences that shape the country. Students will use a variety of geo-technologies and inquiry and communication methods to examine practical geographic questions and communicate their findings.

Transitional - Geography of Canada CGC 1PN (APPLIED)

This course draws upon students' everyday experiences to help them learn about the geography of Canada and the country's place in the global community. Students will have an opportunity to study the country's land forms, climate, soils, plants, animals, and human activities in order to understand Canada's physical character and diversity. The emphasis of the course will be on the practical implications of the study of geography and will provide the students with skills in using the tools of geography in their lives.

Environmental and Resource Management CGR 4M1 (UNIVERSITY/COLLEGE)

This course investigates the complexity and fragility of ecosystems and the pressures human activities place on them. Students will examine ecological processes, the principles of sustainability, and strategies for resource management, with a focus on the challenges of environmental degradation and resource depletion. Students will use geo-technologies and skills of geographic inquiry to explain and evaluate various approaches to achieving a more sustainable relationship between people and their environment. (May be combined with SVN3M1 and Durham College Dual Credit)

Prerequisite: Any University, University/College preparation course in Canadian and World Studies, English, Social Science and Humanities or SVN 3MI.
